

MSc 4Cities (research/practice)

- 120 ECTS curriculum
- Year 1: fixed 50 ECTS (Brussels 30 + Vienna 20)
- Year 2: research/practice internship + elective courses + thesis work
 - Internship with or without Erasmus+ Traineeship scholarship
 - Elective courses: either at UVienna/VUB OR Erasmus exchange with one of our partner universities

Finding an internship

- More ad hoc and individual than the regularized Erasmus+ study exchange procedure:
 - Ad hoc: often, host organizations advertise positions last minute. Limited long-term planning (which runs counter to university bureaucracies...)
 - Individual: student engagement is needed to find an internship. Host organizations don't always have internships available and often look for a specific skill set. And students often have specific interests (theme, type of organization, location, timing) which don't always 'match' with offers from host organizations
- Role of internship coordinators (Bas van Heur and Joshua Grigsby)
 - Communication of internship opportunities
 - Acting as intermediary between students and host organizations (if needed/requested)
 - Management of internship agreements + evaluation and grading of reports



Internship formalities

- 15 ECTS course unit, which equals 375-450 hours (10-12 full-time working weeks)
 - 'Year course', meaning the internship can be done anytime, and also part-time for a longer period than 10-12 weeks
- Register for the VUB course unit:
 - 'Internship' (course code: 4021214ENR)
- Compulsory in 4Cities practice/research tracks
- Learning outcomes:
 - To be able to effectively use your academic skills in an 'urban' work environment
 - To develop the right social skills to function effectively and collegially;
 - To be able to report in a professional manner.



Internship formalities

- Internship without Erasmus+ Traineeship scholarship:
 - Simple procedure. Submission of VUB internship agreement to Bas van Heur and Joshua Grigsby <u>before</u> the start of the internship
 - NOTE: internship coordinators need to agree with choice of internship organization and content/focus of the internship!! No agreement means no recognition as 15 ECTS internship
- Internship with Erasmus+ Traineeship scholarship:
 - Requirement: internship outside of Belgium. 4Cities students need a minimum of `2-country-mobility' for their full curriculum. 4Cities students with full EMJMD scholarship cannot apply for additional Erasmus+ funding

Internship formalities

Canvas:

- All relevant documents can be found on the VUB Canvas learning environment in the 'Community Urban Studies' space.
- Read closely the 'Internship procedure' document

Key steps:

- 1) Submit Erasmus+ Traineeship application (if you want to / can apply for this)
- 2) Submit before the start of your internship the VUB internship agreement
- 3) After the internship: your host organization contact should submit an evaluation form; you should submit an internship report



ADMINISTRATIVE STEPS

Erasmus+ Study Exchange:

- Individual contact with Bas van Heur (during first semester)
- 28 Feb: submission deadline application exchange coordinator
- Final permission for departure after deliberation in June or September (for studies)
- What to submit?
 - Short motivation (max. 1/2 page)
 - Destination partner: preferred option 1, option 2
 - Semester

NOTE: limited places available per partner, there will be a ranking of applications

Application Procedure Erasmus+study exchange

Host Institution Application You apply to your host institution

Official Approval

- Your faculty officially confirms your exchange after the June and/or September exams
- Acceptance by the host institution

Departure Administration

- IRMO invites you to a take-off meeting
- IRMO sends you the scholarship administration





Can I do a paid internship?

- University internship agreements (somewhat confusingly) mention that internships should be unpaid, but this is not quite true.
- Internships can be paid if indicated as 'expense allowance' up to approx. 30-35 Euro per day. Higher allowance is counted as real wage, which means employers pay full social contributions + (Belgian-based) parents can lose child allowance
- Above applies to the Belgian context:
 - In some countries (e.g. France) payment of interns is a legal obligation
 - Combined payment of Erasmus+ bursary and allowance paid by internship organization is not explicitly forbidden



I am a 4Cities student and receive an EMJMD scholarship. Can I additionally apply for Erasmus+ study exchange and Erasmus+ Traineeship scholarships?

- NO
- BUT: you will have to follow the same application procedure as everyone else for the Erasmus+ study exchange (in order to be able to use the exchange agreement)



Can I combine an internship abroad with my study exchange abroad?

- Technically possible, but please note:
- Not allowed to combine Erasmus+ Study Exchange scholarship and Erasmus+ Traineeship scholarship in one and the same semester (no overlap allowed)
- Combination of internship and study exchange in one semester leads to high study load: 15 ECTS internship + min. 21 ECTS study exchange
 - Possible, but check feasability
 - Note: some exchange universities require minimum amount of ECTS taken



Can I combine my internship with my MSc thesis?

- Yes, this is possible and even encouraged. It can be a great (and efficient) way of putting the expertise acquired during the internship to use in your MSc thesis
 - Examples: internship organisation as empirical case for your thesis; develop contacts and networks that are important for your thesis; become acquainted with research skills or bodies of literature also relevant for your thesis
- BUT: important that MSc thesis is substantively new. No simple reproduction of internship output allowed
 - Internship is about gaining experience in the day-to-day work of an organisation,
 not about the design and execution of an individual research project



Can I do an internship or an Erasmus+ study exchange in my 'home country'?

- Yes, you can.
- BUT: you will receive lowest priority in the ranking for the Erasmus+ Study Exchange or Erasmus+ Traineeship scholarship for this period.
- AND: your current residence needs to be in Belgium.
- NOTE: this also applies to 4Cities studens with full EMJMD scholarship.
 Contributions to subsistence costs will be interrupted for the periods spent in the country of residence of the scholarship holder (means: no money!!)



I am a 4Cities practice/research track student. As year 1 only has 50 ECTS of compulsory courses, can I select additional elective courses in Vienna in year 1?

- YES, possible as you are enrolled as full-time student both at the VUB and Universität Wien. Limit: max. 66 ECTS in year 1.
- Course catalogue is usually published end of January. Registration for most courses has to be done in February. No registration in advance is necessary for courses of the type 'lecture' (Vorlesungen). For these courses you only have to register for one of the exams at the end of semester.

- NOTE: combination of 'extra' courses in Vienna year 1 + Erasmus exchange year 2 can be problematic due to minimum ECTS to be followed during the exchange



I am a 4Cities research/practice track student. Can I do my internship and follow elective courses in year 2 in Vienna and/or Brussels?

- EACEA requirement: at least 2 countries, different from country of residence of student
 - Strictly speaking requirement fullfilled after year 1 in Brussels and Vienna
 - Except for Belgians and Austrians: requirement to do an internship or study exchange in a 3rd country
- Year 2, option 1: continue with elective courses in Vienna and/or Brussels + internship anywhere. In Vienna: option to follow courses at Uvienna + other universities in Vienna
- Year 2, option 2: Erasmus+ study exchange with one of our partner universities + internship anywhere



Is it a problem if total number of ECTS of my courses selected at the Erasmus+ partner university ≠ total number of ECTS 'needed' in my MSc 4Cities or MSc Urban Studies curriculum?

- If total number of ECTS is below 120 ECTS, then yes, this is a problem: you need 120 ECTS to be able to graduate.
- If slightly more than 120 ECTS, this credit mismatch is not a problem (up to 1 course 'more' than 120 ECTS).



Will I always be accepted for my preferred Erasmus+ study exchange destination?

- NO. We try to make it possible and we have ample choice with >25 partner universities, but each institutional Erasmus+ exchange agreement specifies a maximum number of students that can be exchanged per mobility period. This is usually not more than 2 students.
- Erasmus+ funding has also been reduced in the last years, making a ranking of student applications likely.
- In your application: specify at least 2 Erasmus+ destinations (preference + alternative)



Erasmus+ KA1 Traineeship <u>after</u> your studies/ graduation

- ✓ Not part of your VUB programme
- ✓ In line with your obtained degree
- ✓ Within 1 year after graduation
- ✓ Apply before graduating, following the VUB rules & deadline, to the VUB and Flanders Knowledge Area
- ✓ Grants are awarded on a first come first served basis
- ✓ Same deadline: March 1st motivation, semester, destination, etc. not needed



German universities can request payment of semester fee, also to Erasmus exchange students

- Not in line with EU rules, but still reality...
- Please check university website and/or ask contact person at exchange university
- Semester fees seem to be between 200 and 400 Euros (but mostly includes semester ticket for public transport)



Non-EU students have a 2-year Belgian residence permit on the basis of a student visa. Does this permit/visa allow one to do an internship outside of Belgium (but in the EU)?

- Well, it's complicated... In most cases, there is no problem. But:
- Some countries consider an internship as work, in which case a work visa is required.
- In practice, every country has its own set of national rules regarding internships.
 - In principle, an internship that is a mandatory part of the curriculum is exempted from the work permit requirement (but national differences in 'interpretation' can still apply).
 - In the case of a non-mandatory internship, stronger differences between countries.
